Please be aware that there are age limits on these apps, such as WhatsApp and Houseparty. We have had to deal with issues relating to irresponsible behaviour of a very small number of children, so please make sure that you talk about safe and respectful online behaviour at home. The advice of the PCSOs is quite right, they say if you wouldn't say it to your Nan or Granddad, then DON'T say it. Good advice, things said in haste or online in text can be misconstrued and cause hurt or embarrassment.

Anti-Bullying Assemblies - with Mrs Bullock

After having assembly with Mrs Bullock about this the previous week, PCSO James and Scott have shared an assembly about bullying and what to do if you are being bullied or witness it. This is an important issue and we need to ensure that children know that they have a voice and that they have a right to be heard.
