Uniform and hairstyles

- Also remember that every day, regardless of weather, they must have a suitable waterproof coat/jacket with them. Thank you.

What do we need to know for this term?

Reading

Please read with your child every day. They must read aloud and must make sure that they fill in their reading diaries with your support. For books for home, they can borrow a class library book, their reading book and a school library book.

<u>Library Visits in school begins next Tuesday (21st September</u> for Years 4, Year 5 on Wednesday and Y6 on Thursday)

Each week it is your child's Merit Assembly, the library will be open for you to pop in to with your child. It will work as follows:



- At hometime, collect your child/ren as normal.
- Make your way to the front of school and come in to visit the school library.
- You are welcome to enjoy reading in the library until 3.45pm.
- Remember to come the week your son or daughter has Merit Assembly. Each week it will be Year 1 or 4 on Tuesdays, Year 2 or 5 on Wednesdays and Year 3 or 6 on Thursdays.

Homework

After the success of using Teams for homework, we will continue to do this. This can be done on almost any device and we welcome photos of learning or pieces processed on a computer. If you have issues with this, please speak with your child's class teacher.





Year 6 Bikeability

We have been successful in securing a 'Bikeability' course for our Year 6 pupils. This is Sandwell's cycling training programme and this scheme replaces the Cycling Proficiency scheme. The children will be trained over 4 sessions in safe bicycle use on the road. They will be trained by qualified cycling instructors to Level 2 of the National Standards for Cycling. An improvement on cycling proficiency is that there is no theory test or final test and instructors will assess on an ongoing basis. Please complete the consent form sent today.



Clubs are due to start next week, which are led by Fit 4 Schools. There will be the following on offer:

 Thursday: Archery for Years 5-6

• Friday: Street Dance for Years 3-4



Each club will be available from **School Comms (from Wednesday)** on a first come, first served basis and cost £2.00 per session. There will be 10 sessions that begin week beginning Monday 20th September and the last week will be week beginning **Monday 29th November**. The cost is £20.00, a one-off payment must be made. You will also be asked to complete a permission slip for your son or daughter to attend.

Water

Thank you to all who are sending your child in with 2 bottles of water each day. Please make sure that you do not send squash in as a drink as this is not a healthy option for them do drink throughout lessons.

If your child has a packed lunch, they may bring water or other non-fizzy drinks to have at lunchtime.

Snacks

We have noticed that some children are bringing share bags of crisps and sweets in. Please remember that we aim to promote healthy eating, so **reasonably sized**, **healthy snacks should be brought in for playtimes**.

End of day arrangements

Please be aware that to remain safe, we will open the gates very close to the bell for the end of the day. When you enter the school to wait, please make sure that you try to maintain distance and that you do not wait by the classroom windows. It is difficult for staff to safeguard their children and can also be distracting for them.



Masses and Assemblies

At this time, we sadly cannot ask you to join us for Mass as we are having Mass with all children every two weeks. But for Merit Assembly, we are meeting in smaller groups, a maximum of 2 people per family are welcome.

CAFOD Go Green Assembly

We will be taking part in a national assembly on Thursday 16th September, it is an assembly to explore how we can help to protect the Amazon rainforest and support communities who live there., where the children will learn about taking better care of their environment. Please ask your son or daughter about it when they get home on Thursday.





School Meals

Thank you to those ordering via Dolce. Mrs Marshall is happy to help if you are struggling to log on.

Also, could we ask that your payments are up to date. If they are not, you will be asked to bring a meal for your son or daughter.

Are eligible for Free School Meals?

For some times in our lives, circumstances can change. If you feel at this time that you may be eligible for free school meals, please ask for help with the form at the office, where we will be happy to help you.

Bags - book bags are preferred

If your child has a different bag, they must only bring a small bag and only bring essentials for the day. These include: reading books (class library book, library book and a levelled book), reading record, snack and a bottle of water), homework/home learning and a lunchbox if they do not have school dinners. Please do not send them in within anything else, it is unnecessary.

Parents' Evenings

Phone calls or Teams meetings for Parent/Carers evenings will still be an option. Face to face meetings are preferable to many, but we will wait for guidance on this. Please look out for dates as they will be coming soon.

Volunteers Required

Volunteer Readers may be allowed to come to school to hear read from this term. If you are able to, please let the school office know or email headteacher@sfxcps.co.uk. Please state days and times you will be able to attend and be aware that we carry out DBS checks as Safeguarding is our first priority.

It is great that Year 4 and 5 have NO LATE MARKS for last week, well done!


