Now imagine that if you wanted to have a drink. What would you do?

You're going to go to your water bottle. But it's empty. OK, not a problem, you can walk over to the tap. You turn on the tap, but nothing comes out. OK, no problem, you can walk to the room next door, try turning on their tap, but nothing comes out. All the taps in the school, and all the taps at home, no water. What do you do now?

Maybe you can ask your mum or dad to ring someone up who lives in the next town/the other side of the city. You hear from them that there is some water there. Great! Or not?

The car is broken, there are no buses and you can't find your scooter. It's going to take you 5 hours to walk to where the water is. 5 hours! Does that sound like a long time?

That's like walking for all the time that you're at school and only resting at lunchtime. 5 hours!

On the other side of town?

But it's OK because you've found some water. Or is it OK? The water that you heard about is in a stream. And the stream doesn't look like the water that comes out of the tap. It's a bit muddy, or a bit green. Does anyone want to drink that? No? But you've had to walk for 5 hours and there is no water anywhere else!



We've just used our imagination to think about this this morning/afternoon. Sadly this is real life for some people around the world.
